CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR ASSISTANT OR ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR IN ETHICS AND HUMAN RIGHTS

The Institute of Applied Ethics (IEA) at the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile announces an international search for a full-time Assistant or Associate Professor position, starting March 1, 2025. The appointed candidate will be expected to engage in academic activities affiliated with the UC Center for Dialogue and Peace. Applicants must demonstrate the ability to develop an independent research line and teaching in Ethics and Human Rights.

The Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile is among the top three institutions in the QS Ranking for Latin American Universities. The University is deeply committed to fostering equal opportunities and building an inclusive, diverse, and fraternal academic community. It is equally dedicated to promoting the academic development of both male and female scholars. In this regard, applications from women are encouraged.

Application requirements:

- PhD (completed or graduation in process).
- Experience developing independent and interdisciplinary research.
- Publications on topics of applied ethics related to the thematic areas of this call.
- Experience in teaching ethics and human rights or related areas, according to the stage of the academic career of the applicant.
- Proficiency in Spanish and English
- Identification with the principles and mission of the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile.

Selection criteria:

- Academic trajectory and quality of research.
- Quality of his or her teaching.
- Academic references.
- Potential to develop interdisciplinary teaching and research.
- Selected candidates should be available to give a class, a research seminar, and to participate in an interview with the selection committee. These activities will be conducted in Spanish.

Application materials (PDF format in either Spanish or English):

1. **Research statement (2 pages):** applicants are asked to describe their research goals in the short and long term, and to indicate potential collaborative networks in Chile and other countries.
2. **Teaching statement (2 pages):** candidates are asked to describe their teaching experience and teaching philosophy, including a summary of a potential applied ethics course in their area of interest to be taught to undergraduate or graduate students.
3. **Curriculum Vitae**, organized in the following format:
 - i. Personal information: name, e-mail address and webpage (if available).
 - ii. Education: list of academic and professional degrees, indicating the granting institutions and their dates (please attach academic certificates).
 - iii. Research:
 - a. Full list of publications (WOS, SCOPUS, and others), book chapters, and books. Among them highlight the three most relevant to applied ethics, and upload PDF copies of the same.
 - b. Participation in research projects, indicating their role in the project, start and end dates, and institution.
 - c. Teaching experience, indicating the institution, course, and nature of the participation (primary instructor, teaching assistant, etc.).
 - d. Other: funding and grants, awards and honors, language proficiency, computer skills, and any other information that may be deemed relevant.
4. **Three letters of recommendation** submitted directly by the remittent.

Application process:

Applicants should send all application materials to eticasaplicadas@uc.cl (Prof. Claudia Labarca) Recommendation letters should be **submitted directly** by the remittent to the same address. Deadline for Applications: **September 30th, 2024, at 17:00 hrs.** Further information can be asked to the provided email address.

Foreigners selected for the position need to obtain a working visa at their local Chilean Consulate General in order to be formally incorporated into the University.
