SCHOLARLY PROFILE

Thana de Campos-Rudinsky is Associate Professor at the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile, where she develops a normative theory of institutional responsibility grounded in the moral values of love and justice. Her scholarship contributes to debates across medicine and public health, law, international affairs, theology, and philosophy. She examines how institutions should respond to human vulnerability—including illness, grief, poverty, and loneliness—and how the principles of solidarity, subsidiarity, and the stewardship of truthful communication can guide better governance across health systems, universities, public agencies, and international organizations. Drawing on *The Global Health Crisis* (Cambridge University Press, 2017) and *The Rule of Love* (Oxford University Press, 2026), she leads an interdisciplinary team developing a Co-Responsibility Scorecard that translates her theoretical framework into evaluative tools for improving institutional practice, leadership, and accountability—beginning in maternal-health settings and scalable to other domains. She recently presented the scorecard to Chile’s Ministry of Health as part of ongoing discussions about its potential incorporation into public policy. A former Fung Global Fellow at Princeton, she also co-directs the Dignity and Equity in Women’s Health program of the UNESCO Chair in Bioethics and Human Rights. Between 2026 and 2027 she will be a visiting research scholar at the University Center for Human Values in Princeton.
